The declared aims of EMODiR are the promotion of national and international research projects; organising seminars, meetings, conferences and workshops; publication of its own activities; supporting interdisciplinary and international collaboration; disseminating research carried out by the group; establishing research networks and academic exchanges.

We send a regular newsletter with information on research activities, conference participation, workshops, recent publications on the subject of early modern religious dissents and radicalism.
