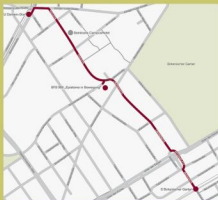
EPISTEME IN

In this workshop, we will be examining the phenomenon of substitution. What does the term entail? Is it a simple exchange of one element for another within a specific context? If so, are the substitutes true equivalents in the sense that they necessarily appear and function in exactly the same way? What are the underlying principles of substitution and what governs the choice of one element over another? How can studying substitution be useful in understanding movements of knowledge?

These are among the questions we will be discussing in this interdisciplinary workshop. The focus will be on Ancient Egypt, with a number of contributions ranging from topics as diverse as funerary offerings and their different manifestations to the peculiarities of the Old Egyptian writing system. Contributions from other fields will include talks about Chinese ornamental writing, social processes in Middle Babylonian medicine and the relationship between Old Babylonian didactic and legal texts.
